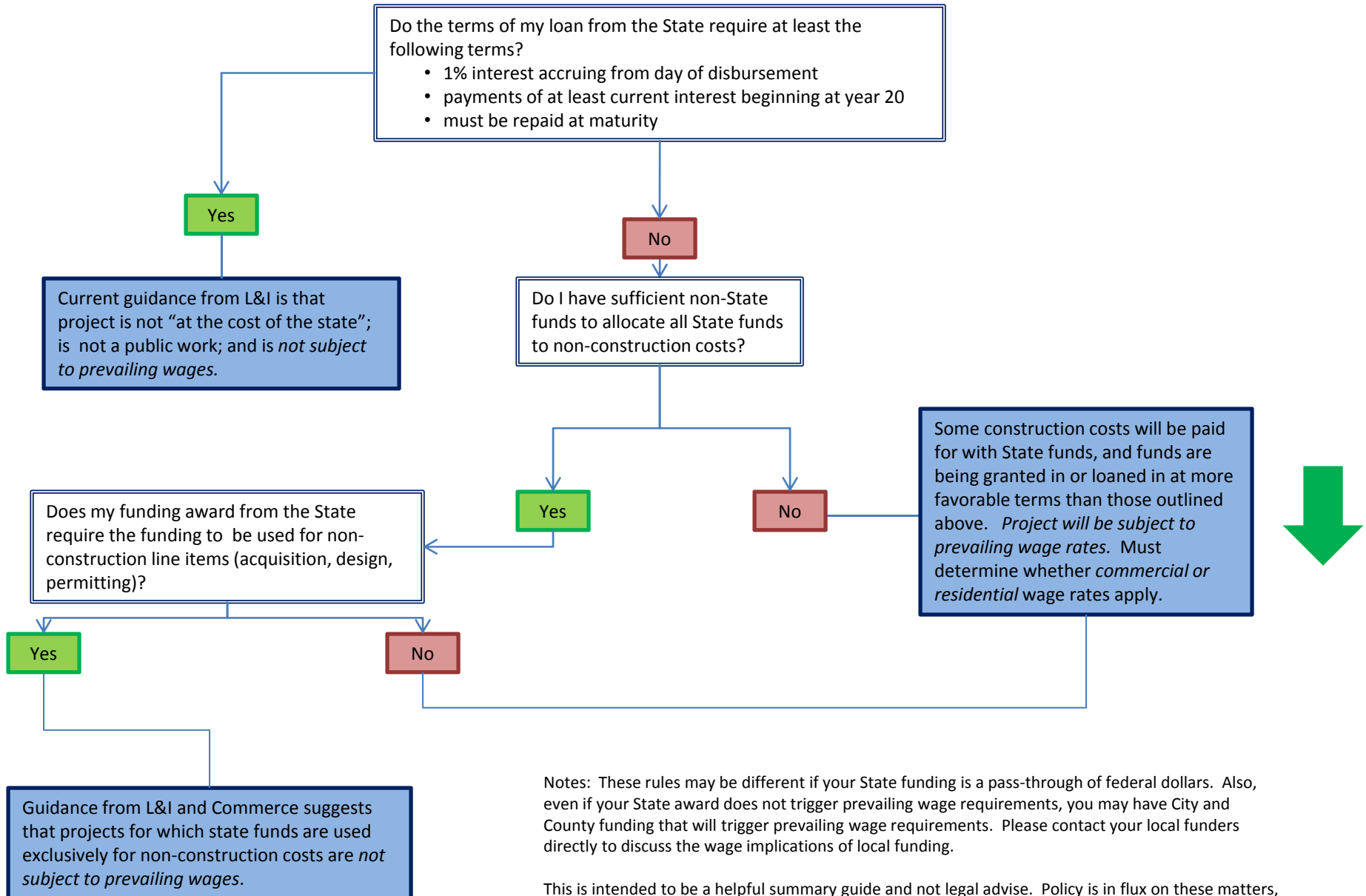


Prevailing Wage Analysis Tree – Recipients of Washington Works or Commerce Funding Awards

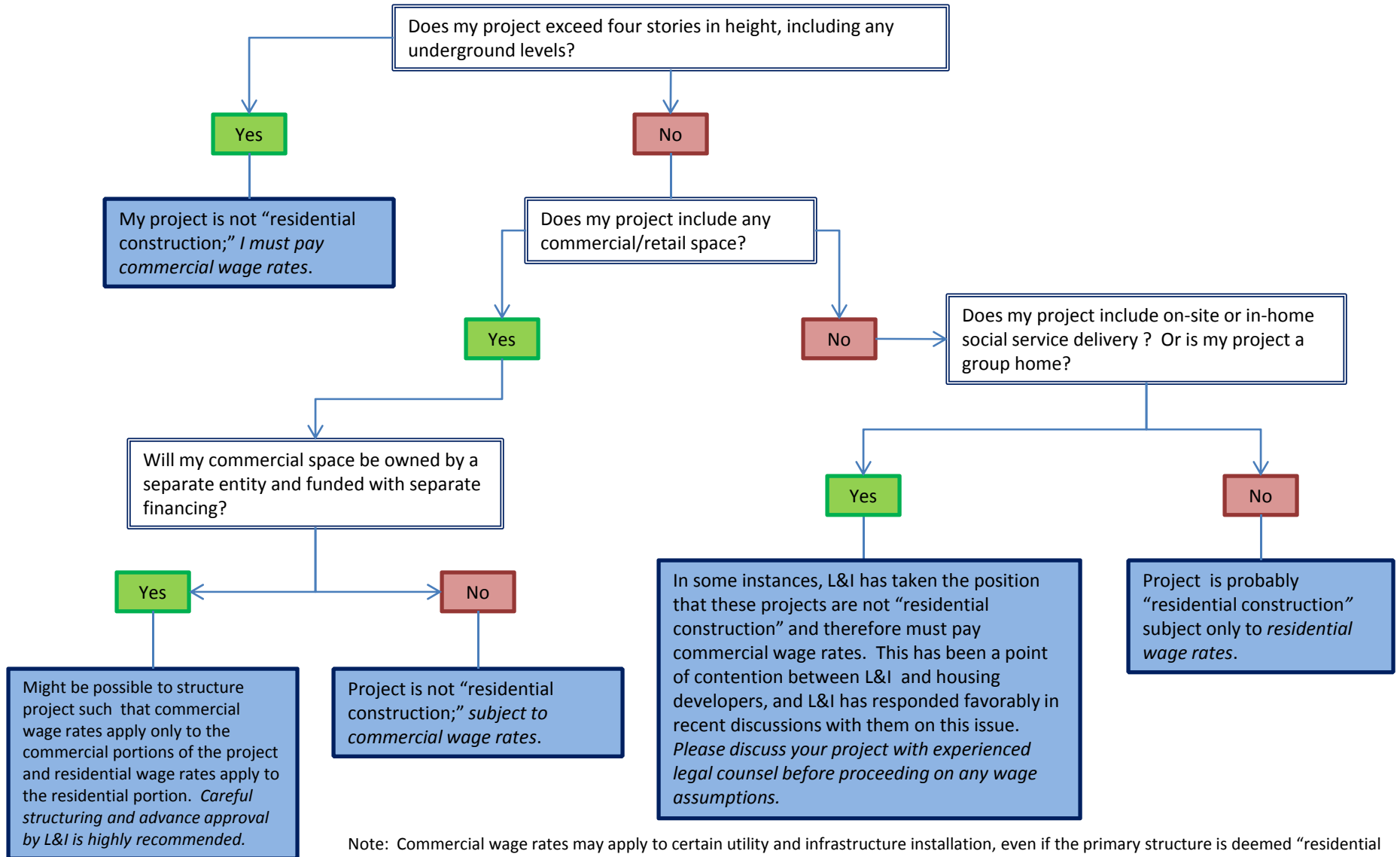
Part I: Is My Project Subject to Prevailing Wage Requirements?



Notes: These rules may be different if your State funding is a pass-through of federal dollars. Also, even if your State award does not trigger prevailing wage requirements, you may have City and County funding that will trigger prevailing wage requirements. Note: Commercial wage rates may apply to certain utility and infrastructure installation, even if the primary structure is deemed "residential construction." Separate community buildings or other structures that are not solely residential will be subject to commercial wage rates.
